- 5- Developing students' abilities in writing and preparing articles, reports and research, training them on legal writing and its conditions, and dealing with various sources of knowledge and benefiting from data and information.
- 6- Preparing graduates who are able to contribute and participate in the performance of legal services and academic activities.
- 7- Strengthening the relations between university formation and the scientific professional community, providing it with specialized frameworks, and enabling students to communicate with others effectively and respond quickly to developments.
